This assignment requires you and a partner to conduct research on a campus resource. You will need to assess the resource you have selected, each write at least 1 page on your findings, and present your information to the class in a 4-5 minute presentation. Please include the following in your paper:

- General Information: Where is the resource located? What are its hours of operation? Contact information?
- Resource's Goals and Purpose: Why was it started and what were/are its goals? What services does it provide and to whom?
- Evaluation/Analysis of the Resource's Effectiveness: Does the resource meet its goals? How could it better serve its target population or the overall student population? How accessible is it to interested students? Did you encounter any difficulties in gathering your information or accessing the services offered? How and why do you think this resource could be valuable to new transfer students? Would you recommend this resource to other students?

In order to gather the information needed to write your paper, you will need to conduct at least one interview with someone who represents the resource or with someone who uses the resource. Please include the names and contact information of the individuals with whom you speak. You will also need to gather, read, and synthesize written information from websites, pamphlets, brochures, etc.
